



# Kumamoto University (Kumamoto Prefecture)

•The purpose of this program is to give basic and professional knowledge and skills in various areas of Japanese education.

## ◇ University overview

### ① Characteristics and history

Kumamoto University (KU) was established in May, 1949 in-corporating several institutions, including the Fifth High School and Kumamoto Medical College. Now, it has eight undergraduate faculties, eight graduate schools and one research institution. There are about 10,000 undergraduate and graduate students, and about 2,700 faculty and staff. KU Graduate School of Teacher Education offers curriculums for Teacher Training Practices and Development. It also accepts working school teachers. The purpose is to improve and achieve the quality of teachers through general researches related to practical educational results.

## ◇ Outline and characteristics of the course for Teacher Training Students

① Characteristics of the program: The purpose of Kumamoto University's teacher education program is to give basic and professional knowledge and skills in various areas of Japanese education. The Faculty of Education conducts specialized courses for students who wish to be kindergarten, elementary, junior, or senior high school teachers in the following subjects: Japanese, social studies, mathematics, natural science, music, art, health and physical education, industrial technology, living sciences, English, special support education (psychology), and school health nursing education.

② Number of students to be accepted: 17 in total

③ Period of scholarship: October 2025 – March 2027 (1.5 years)

④ Requirement for program completion: The course of study varies depending on the academic advisor, but it is necessary to attend lectures, exercises, and thesis instruction in class subjects after consulting with the academic advisor.

### ⑤ Outline of the course

- Japanese language education

Students will learn conversational Japanese and basic Japanese necessary for everyday living and academic researches after entering Kumamoto University. The Japanese classes are provided regarding the Japanese language level of the students in the program. (10hrs/week)

- Specialized training

Individual instruction is provided from the academic supervisor. Students also take regular classes with undergraduate or graduate students to deepen knowledge of their research subject. At the end of academic year, students are expected to present their research achievements.

- Practical training, participatory subjects such as field trips and regional exchanges



- Others
  - Independent field trips by faculty advisors
  - Field trips by academic advisors
  - Hosting exchange parties for international students
  - Participatory courses such as field trips and regional exchanges
